### **Association for Applied Animal Andrology** **8<sup>th</sup> Biennial Conference,** **Vancouver Canada** July 28-29, 2012

The Association for Applied Animal Andrology ([animalandrology.org](http://animalandrology.org)) is an international organization which aims to further understanding of male reproduction (andrology) in those animals which are of interest to mankind. It brings together representatives of science, industry and education to focus on a wide spectrum of relevant endeavors, from maximizing genetic progress in livestock to preserving rare and endangered species.

It fulfills a unique role by facilitating direct dialogue between cutting-edge science, education, and the animal breeding industries within an international context. Its meetings focus upon new developments in animal breeding knowledge and technology, with a strong emphasis on artificial breeding. The latter includes aspects of semen evaluation and biosecurity as well as sperm preservation, transport and insemination. An important part of our mission is to develop standards and training programs for andrological evaluations.

The Association holds a biennial meeting, with every second one being in conjunction with the International Congress on Animal Reproduction (held every 4 years). Our meetings attract outstanding speakers who are world leaders in their respective fields. The most recent meeting was held in 2010 in Sydney and was the first in Australasia. Previous meetings have been in Hungary, Brazil and the US.

Our next meeting is planned to be held in conjunction with ICAR (International Congress on Animal Reproduction) in Vancouver on July 28-29<sup>th</sup> 2012. The theme of the meeting is "Quality Assurance and Biosecurity in the Globalized Andrology Laboratory". The preliminary program is attached.
